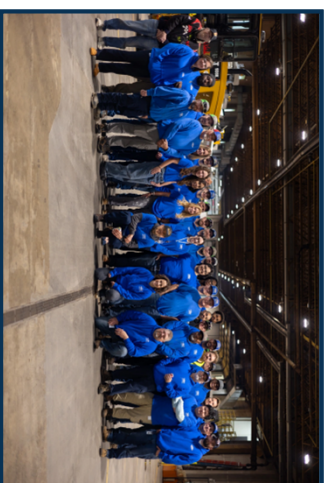

- Municipal-owned buildings and grounds
- 88 miles of storm drains and 40 treatment facilities
- Water and sewer operations

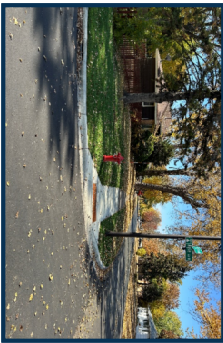
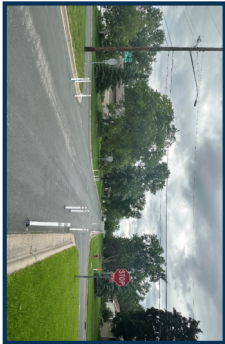
